

Blake Kenneth Hagin

Public Record, Family Context, Education/Training, and Post-Conviction Ministry Research

Updated June 23, 2026

This update adds verified family context, a name-disambiguation section, and the available public record regarding education and training.

Purpose. A source-based summary of publicly available records concerning the 2017 criminal case involving Blake Kenneth Hagin, his reported early release, and publicly identifiable ministry activity afterward. It also separates verified family relationships from unverified same-family-name or alias claims.

Key documented finding. Public reporting states that Blake Hagin pleaded guilty in 2017 to using a vehicle in the discharge of a weapon, received an eight-year prison sentence, and was granted early release in December 2018 with the remaining sentence served on probation. Scope and fairness note. *This report uses public reporting, public ministry-hosted material, and public event promotions. It distinguishes arrest-stage allegations from the documented guilty plea and sentence. It does not make findings beyond the conviction, and it does not treat a shared surname or a people-finder listing as proof of identity or family relationship.*

1. Family context and name disambiguation

Public family-facing ministry content and a public post from Craig Hagin identify Blake as the son of **Craig Hagin and Mia Hagin**. An official 2008 Rhema publication lists Craig and Mia together with their sons Cameron, Blake, and Skylar; Craig later publicly referred to Blake as “our son.” [\[8\]\[9\]](#)

Blake is publicly identified as a great-grandson of Kenneth E. Hagin. The relationship is included only for context because it helps explain the public and ministry attention to the criminal case and later speaker appearances. [\[3\]\[9\]](#)

Important correction: Melissa “Missy” Hagin-Pittman is not documented in the sources reviewed as Blake Hagin’s mother. The public sources reviewed identify Blake’s mother as Mia Hagin. This report therefore does not list Missy as a parent, guardian, or legal relative of Blake absent reliable source documentation.

Names associated with “Missy” in the research request

The following search terms were supplied for research: **Melissa Lynn Robertson; Melissa Hagin; Melissa Hagin-Pittman; and Missy Pittman**. A public real-estate industry directory independently confirms current professional use of **Missy Hagin-Pittman**. [\[13\]](#) The reviewed sources did not provide a primary or official document confirming that every other name in the list belongs to the same person. Accordingly, they are preserved here only as research/disambiguation terms and are **not** presented as verified aliases.

This distinction is intentional. Names from commercial people-search databases, informal social-media captions, or unverified reposts can be incomplete, stale, or associated with a different person. They should not be used to connect criminal, court, property, employment, or family records without a reliable identity match.

Travel with Kenneth E. Hagin

No reliable public documentation was located showing Blake traveled in ministry with Kenneth E. Hagin. Kenneth E. Hagin died in 2003, while reporting placed Blake at age 20 in 2017. The public record supports the family relationship but not a documented travel or ministry-team role. [\[2\]\[9\]](#)

Travel with Kenneth W. Hagin

The reviewed sources did not establish that Blake traveled as a member of Kenneth W. Hagin’s ministry team. Absence of a located public itinerary is not proof that private or family travel never occurred; it simply is not established by the materials reviewed.

2. Educational history and ministry-related training

Verified education/training record is limited. The public material reviewed does not identify a specific high school, college degree, university, graduation year, transcript, or academic credential for Blake Hagin other than ministry- and recovery-related training described below. This report does not infer educational attainment from family affiliation or public speaking activity.

Rhema Bible Training College

A church promotion for an appearance by Blake and Hannah Hagin describes Blake as a graduate of Rhema Bible Training College. A separate church post also describes him as a Rhema graduate and traveling speaker. These host-generated descriptions support that he was publicly promoted as an RBTC graduate; they do not establish the enrollment dates, program, attendance status, or credential details without confirmation from the school. Adult & Teen Challenge / recovery program

A public podcast episode about Blake's testimony states that he attended Adult Teen Challenge after incarceration. A public social-media post attributed to Missy Pittman similarly referred to Blake attending Teen Challenge for nine months and being baptized while there. These are public descriptions of recovery/ministry formation, not independently verified academic credentials. [\[10\]](#) [\[12\]](#)

High school and other postsecondary education

No reliable public source located in this review identified the name of a high school, college, university, degree program, or non-Rhema degree completed by Blake Hagin. A social-media profile search result contains a generic "First high school" field but does not provide a verifiable school name. It is not sufficient to publish an education claim.

Publicly identified post-conviction ministry activity

Publicly accessible church-hosted videos and event promotions show Blake appearing as a testimony or guest speaker after the criminal case. These materials establish the public appearance or promotion; they do not themselves establish credentialing, background checks, supervision, or whether a host reviewed the complete criminal record.

3. Criminal case timeline

Date	Documented event	Source
March 2017	Broken Arrow police arrested Blake Hagin and two co-defendants in connection with a shooting at a residence. The Frontier reported the charge as use of a vehicle in the discharge of a weapon.	[1] [3]
July 24, 2017	The Frontier reported that former Tulsa County District Attorney Tim Harris said he had negotiated on behalf of the Hagin family. The article reported Harris's own statement and did not establish improper conduct.	[3]
Nov. 2017	KTUL reported that Blake Kenneth Hagin, age 20, pleaded guilty to use of a vehicle in the discharge of a weapon.	[2]
Dec. 2017	Public reports state he received an eight-year prison sentence.	[1] [4]
Dec. 3, 2018	KJRH reported that Hagin and co-defendants were granted early release and would serve the remainder of their sentences on probation.	[1]

Charge language versus allegations. Arrest-stage reporting described a drive-by shooting and included police/prosecution allegations. The plea and conviction reporting identified the offense as use of a vehicle in the discharge of a weapon. Allegations are not findings; the guilty plea, sentence, and early-release reporting are the documented disposition. [1][2][3]

4. What is documented about early release

Available reports describe an eight-year sentence in December 2017, followed by early release in December 2018 and probation for the unserved portion. This report uses “early release” because that is how reporting described the action. It does not call the disposition a “sentence reduction” unless a certified court order establishes that legal term. The reviewed articles do not publish the full court order, probation terms, or the judge’s complete reasoning. [1][4]

5. Publicly identifiable ministry activity after the case

August 2024	Andover youth and young-adult conference, Andover, Massachusetts	Public promotion advertised a Blake Hagin Youth & YA Conference.

6. Accountability questions for ministries and host organizations

- What disclosure, restoration, supervision, safeguarding, or accountability process was used before youth or testimony-speaking engagements?
- Were host churches given accurate information about the conviction, sentence, early release, and probation status at the time of each engagement?
- What independent safeguards, boundaries, or mentoring arrangements were in place, if any?
- How do ministries balance a faith-based message of redemption with transparency, victim-centered accountability, and participant safety?
- Where a ministry platforms a speaker with a serious criminal history, what vetting and oversight record should be available to participants and families?

7. Disclosures and limitations

Public-source research only. This report is based on public media reports, public ministry-hosted materials, public event promotions, and accessible public social-media material available as of June 23, 2026. It is not a substitute for certified court records, an official criminal-history report, a school transcript, or a complete ministry personnel file.

Identity and alias limit. The report does not use a shared surname or a commercial people-search result as conclusive proof that multiple names identify the same person. The "Missy" name list is included only as a research/disambiguation record, with the verified professional name stated separately.
